(FOR GENERAL KNOWLEDGE & ABILITY)

- (1) **ELIGIBILITY:** The Competition for the Rector's Prize Shall be open to the undergraduate members of the University except that a student who has won the prize once shall not be allowed to compete for it again.
- (2) **ADMISSION:** applications for admission to the competition be sent to the officer-on-Special Duty (Examination) on or before 04th November, 2014. A prescribed fee of Rs 50/- is chargeable for admission to the competition. The fee is to be remitted by Bank Draft drawn in favour of the Registrar, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007.
- (3) **PRIZE:** Three prizes in order of merit of the value of Rs. 1,000/- Rs. 750/- and Rs. 500/- respectively, shall be awarded in the form of books each year on the result of Rector's Prize Examination.
- (4) **EXAMINATION:** The Examination shall be in three parts:-

PART-I	General Knowledge	One Paper	100 marks
PART-II	General Intelligence	One Paper	100 marks
PART-III	Viva-Voce	One Paper	100 marks

- NOTE:
1. The Examination in Part-I (General Knowledge) and Part-II (General Intelligence) may be held on any day between 20th December to 31st December, each year.
 2. Only those candidates who obtained 65% or more marks in Part-I and Part-II taken together will be called for interview (Part-III Viva-Voce) which will be held on any day during the last week of January 2015.

PART-I GENERAL KNOWLEDGE CARRYING 100 MARKS

- (a) Part-I shall be an examination or test of the General Knowledge of each candidate designed to test
 - (i) his general understanding and appreciation of literature, philosophy, Science and art and
 - (ii) his knowledge of modern world and of recent or current events in varied spheres of life and through
- (b) The setting and marking of these tests will be such as to give greater credit to genuine interest and understanding any topic than to mere memory of scattered facts.

PART-II GENERAL INTELLIGENCE CARRYING 100 MARKS

Part-II shall be a test of each candidate's general ability, intelligence and common sense, including tests of his ability to think and to express himself on various subjects, practical and the practical in English and in one of the Modern Indian Languages and to reason in one language about ideas supplied to him in the other.

PART-III VIVA-VOCE-CARRYING 100 MARKS

Part-III shall be an interview of the candidate by the Board of examiners. The examiners will test the general intelligence of the candidate and also his interest in the world around him.

- (5) **BOARD OF EXAMINERS:** The Examination or tests for the award of the Rector's Prize shall be conducted by a Board of three examiners appointed annually by the Academic Council.
- (6) **AWARDS:** The award shall be made by the Academic Council on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
